

- **Laharpe** (74) - The French seized an almost-completed Venetian ship in 1797 and it entered their navy under this name; captured by Austria at the fall of Ancona in Aug 1799; was not in good shape, so hulked in 1804 (the hulk was Italian from 1806, returned to Austria in 1814 and scrapped in 1815)
- **Beyrand** (64) - The French seized an almost-completed Venetian ship in 1797 and it entered their navy under this name; in Aug 1799 was captured by Austria at the fall of Ancona - it had been scuttled but in 1800 was raised; finally scrapped by the Austrians in 1802
- **Stengel** (64) - The French seized an almost-completed Venetian ship in 1797 and it entered their navy under this name; in Aug 1799 was captured by Austria at the fall of Ancona, but in 1800 was left at Venice “to rot”; in 1805 converted to a pontoon and named *Megera* (armed with one 25 pd gun and 88 smaller pieces); to Italy in 1806, scrapped in 1814

Period from 1814....

- **Saturno** (80) - Was building in Venice when taken over by Austria in 1814; renamed *Emo* in 1815, but was never completed; scrapped in 1823
- **Castiglione** (74) - Commissioned by Italy in 1812 as the flagship of the squadron at Venice, but apparently never left the harbor due to the blockade; taken over by Austria in 1814, but burnt in an accident in Sept 1814
- **San Bernardo** (74) (also called *Mont St Bernard*) - Commissioned by Italy in 1812, but apparently never left the harbor of Venice due to the blockade; taken over by Austria in 1814, but burnt in an accident in Sept 1814
- **Rigenatore** (74) - Commissioned by Italy in 1812, but apparently never left the harbor of Venice due to the blockade; taken over by Austria in 1814, renamed *Severo*, and used as a guard ship at Venice; in 1823 rebuilt as a 56 gun frigate, *Bellona* (the largest frigate in the Navy); from 1824 to 1830 it was the flagship of the squadron in the Levant; scrapped in 1831
- **Reale Italiano** (74) - Commissioned by Italy in 1812, commencing a long career in which it never left the harbor of Venice; taken over by Austria in 1814, but kept its original name; rebuilt in 1825 as a frigate (but perhaps never armed with guns); in 1829 renamed *Italiano* to serve as a school ship (and guard ship in the Venice harbor); scrapped in 1836
- **Duquesne** (74) - Was building for Italy at Venice in 1814; taken by Austria, renamed *Cesare* and launched, but work stopped on the ship in 1816; finally demolished in 1824
- **Montenotte** (74) - Was building for Italy at Venice in 1814; taken by Austria which renamed it as *Kulm* but it was never launched; demolished in 1818
- **Arcola** (74) - Was building for Italy at Venice in 1814; taken by Austria and renamed *Tonante* but it was never launched; demolished in 1821
- **Sigmaring** (74) - Was building for Italy at Venice in 1814; taken by Austria, renamed *Hanau*; never launched, it was demolished in 1825
