

NOTE: The Evzones (light infantry) were organized as independent battalions until 1913, then combined under new regiment HQ; apparently at this point they lost their original designations. The only list showing the old battalions with their home stations dates from 1909. At that point Bns # 1-4, 6 and 7 existed: # 1 - Corinth, 2 - Athens, 3 - Arta, 4 - Trikala, 6 - Tiknaro, 7 - Arta.

Additional bns were created in 1912-13 (see OB above), but the whole force was reorganized in 1914 when the Regt became the basic HQ.

Air Units - In 1914 a rudimentary Air Company existed at Salonika. It disappeared in the tumultuous years that followed, so in 1918 Greece technically had no air force. However, the French established Squadrons # 532, 533, 534 on the Salonika front with French planes but mixed French-Greek crews. In 1919 these units joined Greece as the 1st to 3rd Squadrons.

THE RUSSIAN CAMPAIGN

Greek troops accompanied other allied units to the Russian Black Sea coast from January to April 1919 under French command. The Greek contingent was led by I Corps HQ (Constantine Nider) and supposed to contain three divisions, but just two actually served -

- 2nd Division (IR 1, 17, 34) - To Odessa except IR 34 to Sevastopol
- 13th Division (IR 2, 3, 5/42) - To Odessa except IR 2 to Sevastopol
