-2nd Baltic Front

Formed on 10 Oct 1943 from Bryansk Front (with a mostly new OB) as the Baltic Front; almost immediately (on 20 Oct 1943) was re-designated 2nd Baltic Front. HQ in 12/43 at Toropets. Dissolved on 1 April 1945 (its forces became the "Courland Group" under Leningrad Front).
